Rothman Confers With UJA Federation of Northern New Jersey

(Washington, DC)—On Tuesday, February 27, 2007, Congressman Steve Rothman (D-NJ) met with leaders of the United Jewish Appeal (UJA) Federation of Northern New Jersey. They discussed Rep. Rothman's recent trip to the Middle East and their mutual support for Naturally Occurring Retirement Communities (NORCs). These organizations cater to communities with a large concentration of aging residents.
