Rothman Visits 13 Towns During First Week of August
"Listening Sessions" Tour Throughout Northern New Jersey
Will Host Eight More Town Hall Meetings Next Week To Complete
This Year's Tour of Each of the 37 Municipalities He Represents In Congress

Hackensack, NJ - Answering questions on topics ranging from homeland security to the federal budget deficit, Congressman Steve Rothman (D-Fair Lawn) last week visited 13 towns in his congressional district as part of the first week of his August "Listening Sessions." Rothman will hold eight more town hall meetings next week, which will complete his tour this year of each of the 37 municipalities he represents in Congress.

"The constituents who attended last week's 'Listening Sessions' provided me with some great ideas on ways in which the federal government can help improve the quality of life for the people of Northern New Jersey. I hope and expect that I will hear equally as interesting and insightful thoughts from those area residents who attend next week's town hall meetings," Rothman said. "I was delighted with the turnout for the first round of our August 'Listening Sessions' and am hopeful that even more constituents will attend next week's town hall meetings in eight municipalities in Bergen, Hudson, and Passaic Counties."

As will be the case with next week's "Listening Sessions," each of the town hall meetings held last week was open to all of Rothman's constituents, regardless of whether they live in the municipality in which the meeting was held. During last week's round of "Listening Sessions," Rothman held meetings with his constituents in the following towns: Teterboro, South Hackensack, Bogota, Teaneck, Englewood Cliffs, Palisades Park, Ridgefield Park, Elmwood Park, Moonachie, Rutherford, North Arlington, New Milford, and Garfield. In addition to those meetings, Rothman visited 16 municipalities in February during the first round of this year's "Listening Sessions": Wallington, Little Ferry, Leonia, Carlstadt, Hackensack, Fair Lawn, Hasbrouck Heights, Ridgefield, Cliffside Park, Englewood, Maywood, Lyndhurst, Jersey City, Wood-Ridge, Secaucus, and Kearny. Once Rothman completes next week's 'Listening Sessions' he will have held town hall meetings this year in all 37 municipalities he represents in Congress.
