Ms. Kim, a student at the University of Ulsan, was visiting our nation's capital as part of the U.S. Congress-Korean National Assembly Internship program. Rothman's office frequently participates in this educational exchange program which provides exemplary Congressional interns with the opportunity to study in South Korea during the month of July while their Korean counterparts study in the United States.

"The U.S. Congress-Korean National Assembly Internship program offers American and Korean students the rare opportunity to study one another's government up close," said Rothman, a member of the House Appropriations Committee's Subcommittee on State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs. "Such programs create better, more informed future leaders for both of our nations."

During the exchange, students examine the legislative processes in the United States and South Korea, the history of the two country's bilateral relations, and the economic, political and security aspects of the U.S.-South Korean relationship. Congressman Rothman's intern, Alex Grant, is currently participating in this exchange. Last year, a staffer in Rothman's Hackensack office who was then an intern, Brian Nagle of Glen Rock, N.J., participated in this program and found the experience invaluable.
